## GENERAL MANAGER'S CORNER

Summer is here, along with the heat and dry weather. As we head into Autumn, please remain cautious regarding wildfires. The hillside brush is drying out and the Santa Ana winds will be coming.

This past spring CP Construction replaced a 50-year-old steel 14" pipeline from our Well 31 along the Upland Hills golf course to a centralized water distribution facility near Upland Hills Country Club. The existing pipe was leaky and had reached the end of its useful life.

We are currently out-to-bid on a pipeline replacement project from the Forebay on Mountain Avenue down to Reservoir 4 at Ravina and Paloma Curve. The current pipeline has reached the end of its useful life and runs within backyards along the ravine, a risky location for a pipeline that could suffer a major leak due to age.

We have issued a Request-for-Proposals to design the pipeline connecting our new Well 19 to the domestic water system. This design includes a well-head pump and building along with about 6,000 feet of pipeline. We hope to hire the engineering firm this Autumn with a potential install for late next year or early 2027. Permits and easements are the biggest timing issues.

Finally on the capital project front, we are neck deep in permitting, zoning and environmental review for the Company's new campus on 20<sup>th</sup> Street. We've been working with the City of Upland on the finishing touches and look to break ground in November at the earliest. We intend to fund this new campus from property sales, keeping rates dedicated to capital facility replacement.

On that note, at the July meeting the Board adopted new rates and fees that will go into effect on January 1, 2026. The new rates accomplish two goals: stabilizing company revenue flow during the year and adjusting rates to account for inflation.

To stabilize revenue flow the Company has raised the fixed meter fee and reduced the cost of water. This is a 'net neutral' adjustment that is not intended to bring in any more or less revenue. Current rates generate about 17% of the Company's revenue from fixed meter fees. The new adjusted rates will increase the fixed meter fees to bring in about 30% of the Companies revenue. The remaining 70% of revenue will continue to be through water sales. The monthly charge for a ¾" meter will be going from \$10/month to \$23.14/month. To offset that increase, the Tier 1 water charge will drop from \$0.68/748 gallons to \$.59/748 gallons.

Additionally, the Company will be raising all billing charges 4.75% per year for the next five years to account for inflationary pressure. If you would like more information on our rate study and adjustments, please visit our website at [sawaterco.com](http://sawaterco.com).

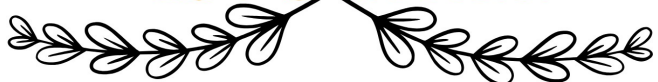

Have you signed up for Waterscope? Waterscope can be a great resource to monitor your water usage and receive alerts for any leaks! A small leak can add up in a two month billing period, so be pro-active and sign up now. All you need is your **account number** and your **meter/VIN number** which can be found on your current water bill (see below). The meter reads are sent to Waterscope, via cell service at midnight every night. The Water Company will not notify you of potential leaks. We have approximately 100 customers/meters that are in bad areas and Waterscope can not get cell service there so these meters have been replaced and will not be available on Waterscope. Contact our office to find out if your meter is available or not in Waterscope.
